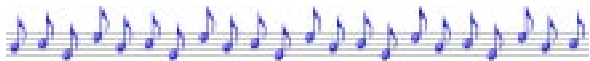
Director's Message...

THE COMMUNITY RESOURCE DATABASE OF LONG ISLAND

Looking for information on local community services? **The Community Resource Database of Long Island** is a free, online directory of health, human service and education agencies in both Nassau and Suffolk Counties. It provides current, comprehensive information on nearly 12,000 community resources for services for children, teens, adults, families and seniors including information on health services, support groups, child and elder care, education, housing assistance, literacy and GED classes, volunteer opportunities, civic and other community organizations. Entries contain detailed information for each organization, including description of services provided, contact information, hours of operation and so much more. **The Community Resource Database** can be accessed through the Glen Cove Library's website, www.glencovelibrary.org (under Databases and Useful Links) or simply visit www.crdli.org to begin your search.

Winner of the 2003 Orange Prize for Fiction, *Property* examines how slavery affected owners as well as slaves and the similarities between the unhappy lives of white women in a man's world and the harsher cruelties of slavery. Join librarians Joanna Cabo and Amy Gretchyn as they lead a dynamic discussion of this riveting novel.

FLASHBACK – 300 YEARS - GLEN COVE CONTINUED

This article on Glen Cove history was published in the Glen Cove Tri-Centennial Journal in 1968.

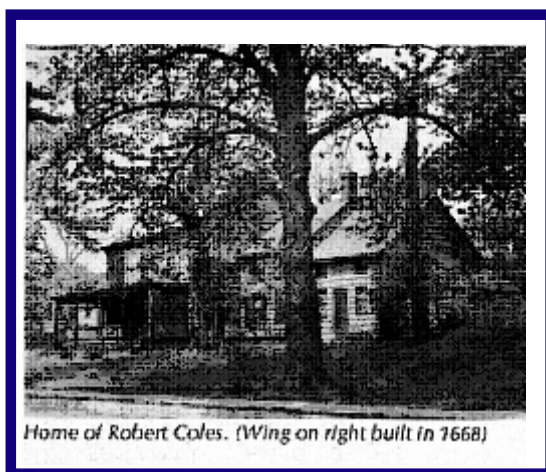
It will be re-printed for your enjoyment bi-monthly.

It is assumed that the first project of the Five Proprietors of the Musketa Cove Plantations was to build a dam across the stream that ran through the valley into the harbor. This was located south of our present Mill Hill, probably not far from the present Glen Cove Avenue extension. Having completed the dam, they then built a sawmill. This provided shelter and made it possible for them to prepare the timbers, planks and other lumber for building their homes. These were erected on their home lots along a short road that they called “The Place”—the name it has retained to this day. It runs in a westerly direction from the top of Mill Hill and then turns to the left at the corner where Ellwood Street begins.

Their homes were of simple construction, but sufficient to meet their immediate needs. Fortunately, we know pretty much of how they looked, because one is standing today and there exists a drawing of another. The one that has withstood hurricanes and fire is the old Robert Coles home, at the northeast corner of The Place and Ellwood Street. The drawing is of Joseph Carpenter’s home. This stood until about 1835, just beyond the western end of The Place.

One who settled at Musquito Cove shortly after the Proprietors was Moses Mudge. In *The Carpenter Family In America*, written by Daniel Hoogland Carpenter, in 1901, we read that on “November 9, 1674, Joseph Carpenter, of Musketa Cove, sells to Moses Mudge four acres of land, butting on ye Saw Mill Dam, which said land he purchased from the Indians in 1668”. This was not his first appearance on Long Island. He was living in the Town of Hempstead as early as 1665, three years before the settlement of Musketa Cove.

From the Mudge genealogy we learn that Moses Mudge was at Warwick, Rhode Island, in 1668. There he married Elizabeth Weeden. It appears that he came to settle at Musketa Cove sometime around 1671. Descendants of Moses Mudge have played a prominent part in the community since that time. On a map made in 1873, it appears that William Mudge, whose residence was on the original home lot at the Place, was a large landholder here.
