### THE GLEN COVE PUBLIC LIBRARY ANNOUNCES 2010 - 2011 BUDGET VOTE AND TRUSTEE ELECTION

The Glen Cove Public Library will present its annual budget to the public for a vote on **Tuesday, April 13, 2010**. Voting will take place in the Library's Community Room where polls will be open from 9am until 9pm.

On April 13<sup>th</sup> the public will also be asked to vote for one member of the five-member Library Board of Trustees for a five-year term. Among other requirements, potential candidates must be over 18 years of age, must have lived in Glen Cove for at least a year, and must obtain a certain number of signatures on a petition. Petitions are now available and can be picked up at the Library Monday through Friday, between 9am & 5pm. Petitions are due back at the Library by **Monday, March 15<sup>th</sup>**, before 5pm.

A hearing on the Library Budget and a chance to meet the candidates running for election will be held in the Library's Community Room on **Tuesday, March 23, 2010 at 7:30pm**.

We all still face difficult financial times. Demand for library usage is up by over 30%. You are borrowing books, DVDs, music CDs and audio books at a record pace, and are attending our programs, connecting your laptops to our wireless system, and using our computers as never before. We welcome the increased demand for our services, and with your help look forward to another year of responding to the growing needs of the community. So please come support us, and vote on our Budget and for a Trustee on Tuesday, April 13, 2010.

### GLEN COVE PUBLIC LIBRARY'S ANNUAL WRITE AND ILLUSTRATE YOUR OWN BOOK CONTEST

Sharpen those pencils and get your creative juices flowing. It's time for our annual book contest. We invite all children in grades 2-5 to submit an original book they have both written and illustrated. Glen Cove librarians will read the books with consideration to grade level. Books will be judged on originality, creative expression, storyline, correct grammar usage and neatness of presentation. Collaboration between author and illustrator is allowed with a limit of two students per book. If computer art or photography is used, credit must be given to the program used and will be judged by its creative use within the story.

Be sure to label all books with name, age, school, and phone number. Teachers who send in a class of books must include a separate typed list of the names of the students entering the contest. Books are due the week of April 12<sup>th</sup>. Winners will be announced the second week in May.

#### FEATURED CHILDREN'S DATABASE: *LEARNINGEXPRESS LIBRARY*

Looking for a way to help your child with grammar school tests? Visit the *LearningExpress Library* database! This database is a comprehensive, interactive online learning platform of practice tests.

To access the *LearningExpress Library* database, visit the Glen Cove Library's homepage, [www.glencovelibrary.org](http://www.glencovelibrary.org), click on the Children's Services tab, select Helpful Databases and click on *LearningExpress*. On the index located on left of the screen, select Elementary School to find practice tests for 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade reading and math proficiency tests.

These tests can be taken online; you and your child will get immediate scoring, answers complete with explanations and an individualized analysis of your results. Tests may also be printed out for use and practice. Success with these practice tests can show adults and children that scoring well on such standardized tests is within their grasp. There are also Learning Centers for middle and high school students as well as test preparation and career-related information for college students and adults, as well.
